




Beverly relates how her father took them hunting, fishing, etc., as he truly loved the outdoors. He was very methodical in everything he did. A hobby which he pursued with passion after retirement was the game of horseshoes, at which he excelled. We also remember, with fondness, him singing and playing the banjo. Several of the Klauses had good singing voices, perhaps inherited from their father, Adolph.

John and Helen built their retirement home in Springside, where John again pursued another hobby, gardening. Visitors would be shown around his large, immaculate yard, with pride. Helen and John maintained a showcase property.





Allan married Luella in 1968, and they have two sons, Garth (Sherrie) who reside in Red Deer, and Alden, in Blackfalls, Alta.



Following this John began working on the family farm where he remained until his retirement in 1974 at which time the family moved into Springside where he resided until his passing. John was the last survivor of the Adolf Klause family. On October 16, 1938, John was united in marriage to Helen Goronzy. This union was blessed with two children. John loved farming but due to reasons of poor health at the particular time, he retired from farming and moved to Springside. In fact, he only began to enter the highly competitive field of horseshoe pitching in tournaments two years ago, but they have proven to be two successful years.

When it comes to clanging horseshoes around slim metal pegs, John Klause is making up for lost time.


His biggest accomplishment came this past weekend when John placed first in the Moose Jaw Packers Event in the provincial horseshoe competitions held in conjunction with the Buffalo Days Exhibition.

"It was a dream come true," commented John as he proudly displayed the beautiful silverware he brought home to his Springside area home.

There was little doubt that some of the top horseshoe pitchers from the province were in Regina. Competition was extremely tough in all events. In fact, with the seven-win, two-loss record, Klause finished in a five-way tie for the top honors in his event. But, with an accumulated point total of 193, he easily out-distanced the nearest runner-up, John Stablyk of Edmonton.

The fact that John lost part of a finger on his throwing hand a number of years ago has not held him back from entering horseshoe throwing competitions. Showing the unique hold that he has had to develop because of his shortened index finger, John commented, "it's just a matter of getting used to your own style."




